CoffeeSafe was recently approached by The Royal Environmental Health Institute of Scotland (REHIS), with a request to provide their members specialised training on the Pressure Systems Safety Regulations (PSSR), in particular how it applies to Users and Owners of coffee machines.

This invitation was greatly welcomed and began with an in person training session hosted at Angus Council in late August. This will be followed by more online training in mid September.

The UK coffee industry continues to grow rapidly and reach into new markets, so raising awareness on the key safety considerations to ensure steam generating coffee machines are suitably maintained and examined at set frequencies in accordance with a Written Scheme of Examination is essential.

The witnessed enthusiasm and drive by the officers in attendance to understand and debate PSSR awareness and enforcement will undoubtedly improve safety in the hospitality market within Scotland.

Subsequent requests for in person training have been scheduled to be hosted at Stirling Council with neighbouring Falkirk and Clackmannanshire in attendance.



"The Royal Environmental Health Institute of Scotland, often referred to as REHIS, was established in 1983. The Institute was incorporated by the Royal Charter in 2001.
